

ORDINANCE NO. G-1121

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE III. TRAFFIC CODE, OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF JUNCTION CITY, KANSAS, BY ADDING SECTION 302.110 AMENDING SECTION 300.030 OF THE STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE.

WHEREAS, Junction City has recognized the need to increase the mandatory minimum fine for first and second offense driving under the influence convictions.

WHEREAS, Junction City has recognized the need to offset the state's mandatory collection of \$250.00 per DUI conviction in municipal court.

WHEREAS, Junction City has recognized the need to deter drunk driving by enhancing the penalties one would face if convicted.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF JUNCTION CITY, KANSAS:

Section 1. ARTICLE III. TRAFFIC CODE, of the Municipal Code of the City of Junction City, Kansas, is hereby amended by adding the following section to CHAPTER 302: GENERAL PROVISIONS:


SECTION 302.110: Amendment to Section 300.030 of the Standard Traffic Ordinance; Minimum Fines Charged for Driving Under the Influence

Section 300.030 of the Standard Traffic Ordinance of Kansas Cities as adopted from year to year shall be amended as follows, the remainder of the ordinance to remain as published in the adopted Standard Traffic Ordinance:

- A. Section 300.030(b)(1)(A)- All provisions in this section shall remain the same and in full force, except the mandatory minimum fine shall be set at a mandatory \$1000 for all first time convictions.
- B. Section 300.030(b)(1)(B)- All provisions in this section shall remain the same and in full force, except the mandatory fine range shall be modified to reflect a mandatory minimum of \$1500 with a mandatory maximum not to exceed \$1750 for all second time convictions.

This ordinance shall become effective upon publication in the Junction City Daily Union as required by law.


